We are grateful to all parents who committed and had their children participate in our online programmes. We were also able to write our exams virtually.

While we have concerns about how quickly our children who have not been engaged in any academic learning will adjust; we hope that they will settle down quickly so we can proceed with teaching and learning.

JUNIOR HIGH ACADEMIC CALENDAR

According to the Ministry of Education and the Ghana Education Service, Junior High School will be running a two-semester schedule this academic year.

Their dates for the first semester are as follows:

Re-opening: January 18th, 2021

Mid-semester break: March 15th – 19th, 2021

Easter break: April 1st – 5th, 2021

Vacation: June 12th – July 5th, 2021

PRE-SCHOOL & BASIC 1-6 ACADEMIC CALENDAR

According to the Ministry of Education and the Ghana Education Service, Pre-School and Basic 1-6 will be running their usual 3-term schedule this academic year.

Their dates for the first term are as follows:

• Re-opening: January 18th, 2021

• Easter break: April 1st – 5th, 2021

Vacation: April 17th – May 3rd, 2021

SCHOOL FEES, PAYMENT SCHEDULES AND STRUCTURE

JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Since JHS will be running a semester schedule rather than a termly one, their fee structure has also significantly changed. For the five and a half month period they will be in school (instead of the usual 3 months), their figures have been calculated to reflect the length of time they will be in school.

JHS DAY SCHOOL FEES

For a semester, they will pay a full term's fees (tuition) plus half a term's fees.

As discussed in the last PTA meeting with parents, the fee payment structure for JHS Day is as follows:

- 40% of amount on reopening (18th Jan.)
- Remaining 60% to be split into 4 instalments (15% of the fees)

We have lost a lot of time due to the challenges of the previous year and we ask that parents and guardians take an active role in the supervision of their children's work to ensure that their academic work is at the optimum.

Also very important is the need for parents to follow the fee payment schedule diligently this academic year. We need your support in this regard to run the school.

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS AND SAFETY MEASURES

Day students are expected to be properly masked every day. On arrival at the school every morning, they will be expected to wash their hands at the gate and go through a temperature check as well. Please provide your ward with hand sanitizer.

Parents are encouraged to give their children who are coming into the boarding house enough nose masks as well as a bottle of hand sanitizer. The nose masks must be marked clearly with the names of the students. Parents should kindly educate their children on the need to remain masked and observe all the safety protocols at all times.

The school will provide enough Veronica buckets and set-up hand washing stations at various vantage points for students and staff.

Parents who are able to support the school with gifts of Thermometer guns, Veronica buckets and Sanitizer or Soap dispensers are welcome to do so. These would be greatly appreciated.

SCHOOL HOURS & EVENING SCHOOL

We are still waiting for government to indicate how many hours the children will be in school to determine whether Evening School can take place so we will hold on with Evening School except for boarders.

SICK/RECOVERY BAY

The School has put in place a contract with the Royal Medical Agency Clinic at Sakaman which has been our school clinic for many years.

This will come at a cost of GH¢ 25.00 per term. Any child who falls sick will be taken care of for free under the contract and serious cases will be referred to the doctor. Management of the school has decided to bear the cost for this term and will begin billing students from next term.

Each student/pupil will pay GH¢ 25.00 a term under the contract [Proposal attached, please].


