SCHOOL FEES & PAYMENT SCHEDULES

Student bills were made available last year on the final day of term.

For Day students, the payment plan is as follows for those who are unable to fully pay at the beginning of the term:

DUE	Due Date	Instalment
50%	Tuesday, September 10, 2024	1st
25%	Monday, October 1, 2024	2nd
25%	Tuesday, November 5, 2024	3rd

The 3rd instalment is the final instalment of fees and parents must ensure that by then their ward's fees have been settled in full.

For boarders, the payment plan is as follows for those who are unable to fully pay at the beginning of the term:

FEEDING



Many day students pay their feeding fee monthly. We would like to encourage parents to sign up to pay monthly to help us to stop the daily market trips which are quite costly overall. Being able to buy our food items in bulk would greatly help us.

Please note that those who genuinely cannot afford to make monthly payments can still make weekly payments.

Please note that whether one opts to pay weekly, monthly or termly, payment is due **in advance** of whatever period one is paying for.

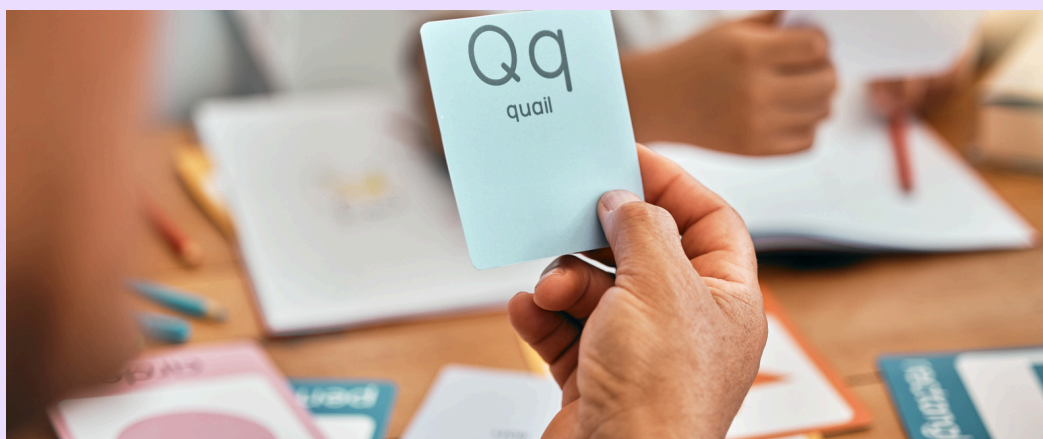


MATTRESSES FOR BOARDERS

Since the inception of the Boarding School, the school has always provided mattresses for boarders. It is becoming increasingly difficult to provide mattresses or even maintain them. Our mattresses were all leather-covered by Latex Foam. Students have torn these covers and destroyed the bulk of these mattresses. We have had to and are having to dispose off mattresses.

At the beginning of each school term, the school is fumigated at a cost of GHS 2000. With a specialized fumigation to combat the incidence and spread of bed bugs and rodents, we are having to pay about GHS 6000 for fumigation and cleaning.

This cannot be sustained. Parents should therefore prepare to buy mattresses for their children [starting next term] and take them home every term.



PARENTS' ROLE AND COMMITMENT

Our gratitude goes out to parents who support their children in their academic work. We really appreciate you. We would ask that parents and guardians take an active role in the supervision of their children's work to ensure that their academic work is at optimum level. One way to actively do this is to attend Open Days in order to discuss your child(ren)'s academic work with their teachers. Parents are also encouraged to periodically call for their child(ren)'s books, look at their work, sign their homework, etc.



It was quite unfortunate to note that our PTA meeting last term was not well attended. This term also, we would like to give an opportunity for parents and staff to get together to discuss matters concerning the school and its stakeholders' growth and well-being.

We hope that parents will turn up in their numbers for this meeting.

The date and time will be communicated in due course.



Evening School is highly necessary for Junior High 2 and 3 students especially. We have some external teachers who support us with their expertise as examiners.

We encourage parents to enroll their wards for Evening School.

This is at a monthly cost of GH¢ 200.00 [subsidized fee for supper inclusive].

It will run from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m.

In view of the fact that some very good externals come at the weekend, JHS 2 and 3 parents are encouraged to consider getting their children to school for this.

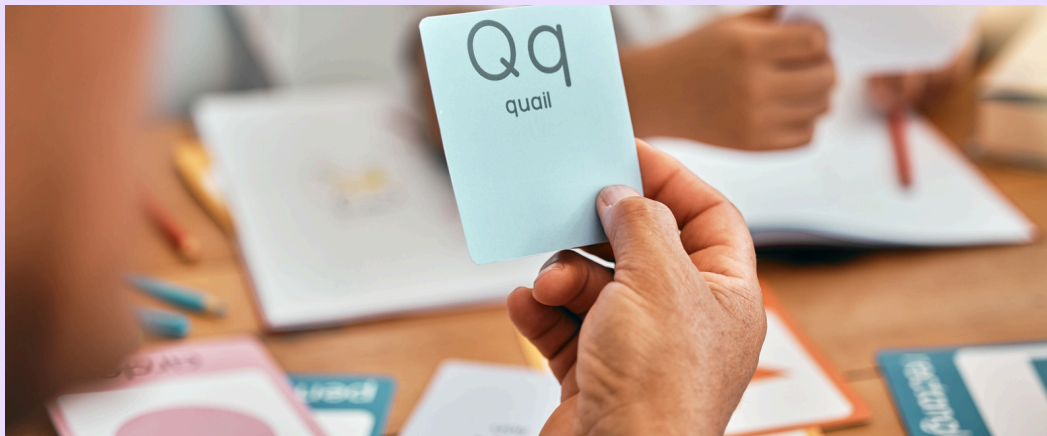


HYGIENE PROTOCOLS AND SAFETY MEASURES
